

Chicken Pot Pie

A simple mouth-watering meal full of healthy ingredients and quite easy to make. This one is dedicated to Denny Adams, Grand Lodge Secretary of Indiana. It is a favorite of his and you will love it as well. The term "a chicken in every pot," was President Herbert Hoover's sign of prosperity. It really dated back to the 1600's to King Henry IV of France. That is your history lesson for this month. Let us get cooking! One- 9-inch round pie serves 4-6 people. The actual cooking time is one hour.

Ingredients:

2 2/3 cup all-purpose flour 1 tbsp. sugar 1 tsp. salt
½ cup all-veg. shortening, cold 7-8 tbsp. chilly water
½ cup of cold, unsalted butter cut in 1-inch pieces
1 1/2 cup frozen mixed veg. 1 1/2 cup cooked chopped chicken or turkey.
One egg (optional) 10 1/2 ounces cream of chicken soup

Directions:

Mix flour, salt, sugar in a mixing bowl. Add in shortening and butter. Blend with your fingertips until pea sized chunks. Sprinkle in 7 tsp. water to quickly form a dough ball. Divide the dough in half making a dough crust. Form two disks. Wrap in clear wrap and place in the ref. for ½ hr. Remove from the ref. and roll one crust onto a 9-inch pie pan. Add the filling evenly. Cover the top of the pan with the other pie sheet. Press edges together with a fork. Add 4-5 air holes into the top crust. Poke a hole in the center of the top crust. Bake for 40-50 min. or until golden brown, at 375 degrees. For a shiny crust, brush a beaten egg and one tsp. of water over the top crust.

Remove from oven to a cooling rack for 5-7 minutes. Cut slices as needed.
